Spoil your taste buds with the wide variety of cuisines which Singapore has to offer. Singaporean food reflects the country's multi-cultural population, which houses everyone from Chinese to Malay and Indian to Peranakan. Each of these cultural groups have intermingled in Singapore for decades, and no visit to Singapore is complete without a taste of some of the following local delicacies:

### **CHILLI CRAB**

One of Singapore's most well-known signature dishes, made by frying crabs in a fragrant red sauce.

### **HOKKIEN PRAWN MEE**

A combination of yellow and white noodles fried with seafood and lard.

### HAINANESE CHICKEN RICE

Often known as Singapore's national dish, this is a favorite among locals and tourists alike.

### FRIED RADISH CAKE

A snack made with steamed rice flour and white radish, fried with egg and garnished with spring onions.

### **FISH HEAD CURRY**

A Singaporean dish of Ikan Merah (red snapper fish), cooked in a spicy-hot curry with vegetables.

### **CHAR KWAY TEOW**

Translating to "stir-fried ricecake strips", this is a popular noodle dish around the Southeast Asian region.

### **ROTI PRATA**

An Indian dish that is similar to a pancake, generally eaten with curry or sugar.

### **BAK KUT TEH**

A soup made with pork ribs and spices, also called "Meat Bone Tea".

### **SENTOSA ISLAND**

Sentosa Island is a popular island resort in Singapore, with attractions like a 2-km long sheltered beach, Fort Siloso, two golf courses, 14 hotels, and the Resorts World Sentosa. Resorts World Sentosa Singapore is the first ever integrated resort on Sentosa Island, which includes highly anticipated and exciting new attractions such as Universal Studios Singapore<sup>TM</sup> and FestiveWalk<sup>TM</sup>, and the soon-to-open Marine Life Park<sup>TM</sup>.

### **GETTING THERE**

The island is accessible by the Sentosa Express monorail, which can be boarded at the Vivo City Shopping Mall. It can also be reached by Cable Car, which originates from Mount Faber and passes through HarbourFront en route to its final destination at Imbiah lookout. Visitors can also access the island via the Sentosa Boardwalk, which is a leisurely stroll from VivoCity Shopping Mall's waterfront promenade, made easy by two-way canopy-covered travellators. The Sentosa Boardwalk is a new and exciting dimension of the Sentosa Experience, which enhances the seamless accessibility and connectivity between the island and the mainland.

## HAWKER CENTRES

These cooked food centres are open-air complexes that house a variety of inexpensive food stalls. Typically found in city centres, they sprang up following rapid urbanization in the 1950s and 1960s, in part to help address the problem of unhygienic food preparation by unlicensed street hawkers. In Singapore, hawker centres are beginning to lose popularity due to growing affluence, and many are being replaced by indoor, air-conditioned food courts.

### ICANN 1 (March 2-4, 1999)

As ICANN's debut public meeting, ICANN 1 was held just 5 months after the organization's formation and laid the groundwork for future conferences.

### ICANN 41 (June 19-24, 2011)

ICANN's second meeting in Singapore, ICANN 41 drew about 1,341 participants.

### ICANN 49 (March 23-27, 2014)

Leading up to ICANN 49, NTIA announced that it would begin the transition of key DNS functions. This topic dominated discussions within almost all groups at ICANN 49. It would later be known as the IANA Transition.

### ICANN 52 (February 8-12, 2015)

ICANN 52 is ICANN's fourth meeting in Singapore. The city was chosen as a back-up after the meeting's original city, Marrakesh, Morocco, expressed concerns about participation from African attendees due to the Ebola epidemic in the


# DO SOMETHING STRANGE
